#### **Ontario Provincial Update**

There was discussion about the provincial plan to earmark \$200 million of cap and trade revenue for cycling infrastructure. There is also a plan to stop municipalities from having minimum car parking space requirements which will free up land and promote transit, walking and cycling. Discussion about innovation in Ottawa, where a condo has a bike room, and building is adjacent to a bike route. Discussion about MPP Eleanor McMahon challenging Toronto Councillors to come ride Toronto streets to see how it feels to cycle in traffic without separated cycle tracks. Lisa, Alina and Dayle participated in Ontario Bike Summit Toronto cycle track tour, where they experienced the separated lanes.

Polly submitted additional correspondence indicating that Niagara Region, Grimsby and Hamilton, are/have edited her motion for their municipality's approval to send to Ministry of Education. See item 9.2 in <u>BCAC Apr 2016 Agenda</u>. Brampton Planning &

Infrastructure Services Committee approved the Motion to Ontario Ministry of Education and directed staff to prepare a report. See item 9.3 <u>PIS Jan 25 2016 Minutes</u>. Nelson Cadete reported back to PIS. See item 7.1.1 PIS Apr 25 2016 Agenda. PIS Apr 25 2016 Minutes show that Nelson's report was approved:

#### **Brampton Community Rides**

Lisa reported the first ride was judged successful, given the cold, windy, sleet and hail conditions. 16 of the 36 registered cyclists participated. Three of the 16 were new riders who are enthusiastic about signing up and bringing their families to other Community Rides, Bike the Creek and Critical Mass. Lisa noted that Mississauga's first ride 4 years ago started with 2 volunteers and the Councillor, and now is wildly successful with over 100 participants regularly. Brampton has 10 Ward Rides of 5 & 15km, all organized & posted to individual pages on the website. Eventbrite is used for registration. Lisa encouraged Council on Mar 30<sup>th</sup> to participate and promote in their newsletters and social media. See Item 5.2 Council Minutes. Dayle posted blog about first ride.

5.1. Announcement – 2016 Cycling Events

(Council Sponsor - City Councillor Bowman)

Kevin Montgomery, Co-Chair, Cycling Advisory Committee, announced the 2016 Cycling Events taking place in Brampton, and provided a presentation outlining the sponsors and partners, June 2016 Bike Month, Bike to Work Day, Bike to School Week, Bicycle Rodeo, and Bike the

#### Creek.

City Councillor Bowman, announcement sponsor, acknowledged the efforts of Brampton's Cycling Advisory Committee in organizing the cycling events.

Several BikeBrampton and BCAC members lined the Council gallery to support Kevin. For the benefit of new members, Lisa explained that BCAC has 4 subcommittees: policy, infrastructure, programs, and Work Plan.

#### **Regional Update**

David welcomed Cherry Skerritt. Cherry came to the meeting as a resident. Members will remember her key role in our successful partnership on the <u>McHardy Court Bike Repair</u> Clinic of December 2014, where Gerald and Peter trained young adults on basic bike mechanic skills. Other members assisted and donated bicycles.

#### Bike to School Week (B2SW)

Part of the GTHA event under bikemonth.ca has 18 schools registered in Brampton of the 38 schools in Peel. Target is 50; 25 last year. The poster has been sent out to all Peel Public Health Nurses for use in both school boards. Erica has been distributing prizes to schools who have already registered: helmets, bells, stickers, bike bracelets, Bike Booster Safety Tips Postcards, and bike walk maps. The first 30 schools registered received a poster for children who bike to school to apply stickers each day. Lisa reported that last year she (as a parent) organized B2SW at Robert J Lee Public School. This year, the school initiated by signing up on their own, and then approaching her to help. Every day during bike week, her son will read aloud at announcements a different tip from our Brampton Cycling Safety Tip Sheet. The Principal found the Tip Sheet on our website 'useful links'. (Kevin & David compiled this sheet in 2014 from a MTO Road Safety Challenge grant.) Lisa reminded us RJ Lee had 45-77 students from the start to the end of the week last year. Their bike racks comfortably park 55 bikes. The Principal is targeting to double the participation this year and they will need to find extra bike storage capacity. Lorie is working with Massey Street Public School, who has signed up and received their helmets, bells, stickers and poster. Their school has no bike rack. Lorie, David and Jocelyn Cann (PPH) are working with St. Lucy Catholic Elementary School on a Jun 9<sup>th</sup> Bike Fair. BikeBrampton donated traffic safety items to Centennial Senior Public School for their cycling event this week. Discussion about the main difference this year is that schools are contacting members for assistance with programming.

#### **Secondary School Toolkit**

A toolkit of 30 pages has been developed by a subcommittee of PSARTS, which encourages, explains

how to create school travel planning routes. Visuals and artwork is being created for the roll-out pilot in Sept. The partners include Public Health, Public Works, PEYA, Peel Police, City of Mississauga, City of Brampton, Town of Caledon, TRCA, BikeBrampton and BCAC.

### BikeBrampton Project Updates

Legacy Cycling Infrastructure
 "Big Ask" for Brampton /Peel

Lisa gave background on the unusual meeting of 3 levels of government immediately following the cycling tragedy of Hardeep Singh Pahra on Steeles Avenue, Oct 29, 2015. Discussion about honouring a memory in a positive manner that acknowledges a tragedy yet moves forward and encourages an inherently safe and healthy mode of travel. Discussion about the need for more downtown bike parking and the example of beautifully and varied coloured bike racks in Kitchener. Discussion about benefits of whimsical vs more traditional design style. Discussion about the need for bike parking spread around to accommodate cyclists – example at box store plazas. However there is a need for additional concentrated parking in the downtown, for both practical and symbolic reasons. Discussion about 'bike repair posts' at Kipling subway and in Ottawa, where basic tools are ready for use of passing cyclists.

**Motion:** to request Brampton's arts community to design bicycle parking for Garden Square that incorporates a positive uplifting message, honours Mr. Pahra, encourages and welcomes cyclists to Brampton downtown. – moved by Polly – carried

#### 3. Brampton Kids on Bikes Project

David reported that the recent PSARTS (Peel Safe & Active Routes to Schools Committee) was among the most effective he has ever attended. There was representation from all the stakeholders. Peel Public Health has committed to supporting 100 schools for travel planning by June 2017. Since each nurse is responsible for 19 schools, schools could benefit from assigning a champion to each school.

David delegated to Peel District School Board on May 10<sup>th</sup>, where he:

congratulated the Board on the progress made in the past year. Peel Public Health and the school boards have signed the Healthy Schools Partnership Declaration underscoring the critical linkage between health and education, and defining the collaborative relationship between the school boards and the public health unit. Stakeholders comprising the Peel Safe and Active Routes to Schools Committee have drafted an active transportation in schools strategy framework, which sets the transportation vision and path for Peel schools where active transportation appropriately combined with public transportation becomes the normative choice for travel to and from school within the next 5 years. The program launches in earnest this fall with 100 schools across both school boards being targeted for school travel planning implementation between now and the summer of 2017. He thanked the custodial staff for installing the remaining bike racks from the 2014 Peel Bike Rack program. He noted some schools still have no racks at all. He thanked PDSB for the excellent production of the videos and "Did you Know" posters as one of the partners in the Peel School Safety Committee program, led by Peel Police that started with 8 schools in the fall and a further 8 this winter for Winter Walk Day. Events were run for both parents and the kids. The program was a rousing success within the chosen schools. Peel Police along with BikeBrampton members presented the safety videos at parent council meetings where they talked about Kiss

and Ride safety, health and academic performance benefits of active transportation. Schools participated in the CAA pedometer challenge where the top school reported over 3.9 million steps by the kids walking to school during the challenge period! The top 3 schools logged more than 1 million steps each. In many of the schools more than 50% of the school population participated. Almost all of the schools want to continue with the challenge. This year, Bike to School Week plans to double the number of Peel schools participating. Over the past year, the stakeholders involved in The Peel Safe and Active Routes to Schools committee have set ambitious targets and timelines to re-establish walking and cycling as the primary way for children to travel to and from school. Continued School Board participation and support is crucial to achieving the 5 year Vision. The next 12 months will see accelerated implementation of wellness programs such as school travel planning within selected school families. Successful implementation could benefit operationally if the boards were to identify a health and wellness focal point in each school. These champions would work with Peel Public Health to implement the programs, events and actions appropriate for each school's unique health needs.

PDSB Board Chair Janet McDougald expressed support and directed the IT staff to promote Bike to School Week on the board website.

David sent an update to Dr. de Villa, Peel Medical Officer of Health, noting the improvements he has seen since Dayle's and his first meeting with her a year ago and their follow up meeting Nov 2015 and reporting on his delegation to PDSB.

#### Peel School Safety Committee Peel School Walk & Bike page

Presentations are being/were made at 16 schools in Brampton and Mississauga in conjunction with the Winter Walk Day. Peel Police invited BikeBrampton members to help with the Q&A sessions. Dayle & David will be presenting at Faustina Public School 7pm May 18<sup>th</sup>. Members have booked additional schools. Lorie reported that David and she presented to Massey Street PS on Apr 21<sup>st</sup> to Parent Council. Lisa and David presented to RJ Lee PS on May 5<sup>th</sup>. Lorie has booked the Bike Rodeo elementary school kit from Christine Hallett at Region of Peel Police's Safety Village for Massey Street PS bike club and Bramalea CycleFest week.

<u>Peel Walk & Bike to School Videos</u> – Erica to request Samantha to show videos before movie nights in Garden Square Discussion about videos trailers shown before Movie nights May 21<sup>st</sup> and 28<sup>th</sup>.

Cherry asked about the Francophone School Board. Discussion followed about the large numbers necessitating bussing. The <u>Bike Booster Safety Tips postcards</u> are available on our website in French. PDSB and DPCDSB are in the process of translating the Peel Walk & Bike to School online brochure into 3 languages: French, Punjabi and Urdu. All 4 videos are targeted for subtitling in these 3 languages.
