# 2017 05 04 BikeBrampton Meeting Minutes (Thursday May 4<sup>th</sup>, 2017)

- Meeting started at 6:36pm
- Motion to approve previous minutes Steve carried

# • Brampton City Update

# 1. Traffic Calming

- David reported results of the traffic calming projects
  - Mountain Ash the vote was for urban shoulders.
  - Richvale north of Sandalwood, the vote was to do nothing.
  - Discussion about amount of traffic congestion on Richvale ½ hour before school is out.
  - Discussion about need for greater enforcement of anti-idling by-law
    Discussion about creating no parking zones within 500m of a school and parents can apply to drive child to school only if child is disabled
  - Discussion about implementing a program for walk or cycle mentors where older children would be matched with younger children for school travel. Need for more parent education. Publicize Lisa's story about how walking to school by themselves teaches children to be independent.
  - Discussion about Clark Blvd PS BikeBrampton attended Family Fitness night with lots of parents keen on having their children walk or bike to school. VP related serious congestion problem at Clark Blvd.

#### 2. Ghost Bike ride

- Deferred to next meeting
- Kevin to ask Constable Paul Coretta to come to future BikeBrampton meeting to speak about road safety
- David to follow-up with Sgt. Heather Andrews on bike accident stats in Peel

### 3. Etobicoke Creek Trail update

- David indicated Kennedy Valley Trail surface will initially be gravel with construction to start in July. TRCA is seeking additional funding to pave in the future.
- TRCA to send out crew to check on trail surface north of Mayfield (we have found no change from condition of coarse gravel last fall)
- Discussion about the trade-off of asphalt vs. gravel gravel means the trail cannot be used in the winter months.
- Discussion that the TransCanada trail spring run-off has created deep fissures
- Discussion that TRCA have paved both the Humber and Don trail networks, so why not the ECT?
- David committed to inviting Vince (TRCA) to the next BikeBrampton meeting

- **4.** Council delegations: David delegating about Bike the Creek on May 31, 9:30am to Committee of Council. Agenda see page 3 for description, pages 11-31 for slides
- Main/Queen Streetscape John reported 2 choices are being presented to Council on May 31<sup>st</sup> and both include bike lanes (road grade or raised at sidewalk grade options)
  - John has had discussion with project manager to recommend bike lanes be continued south to Steeles rather than having the bike route divert on Wellington west to Mill. Discussion about the treatment for the other project limits, i.e. that the bike lanes should be extended to Mill St in the west, to Centre St. in the East and to Church in the north. Elizabeth St would be better than Mill St.
  - Also raised concern that cross-rides are not included in the initial alignment.
    Should be included as the project goes to the next phase.
- **6. Main St. LRT** Dayle reported she sent a letter to Metrolinx expressing concern regarding cycling infrastructure treatment at 407 crossing under the proposed project. (no response yet)
- 7. <u>Community Rides</u> 14 scheduled from May 28<sup>th</sup> Sept 24<sup>th</sup> Be in touch with Lisa, if you want to volunteer and have not already signed up. Easy <u>registration on city website</u>, even for volunteers. Posted on <u>BikeBrampton website</u>.
- 8. Ontario Bike Summit (OBS), Apr 12<sup>th</sup> Kevin and Polly attended on behalf of BCAC. Polly submitted her report. Dayle was there for the awards supper, thanks to Region of Peel. Brampton was presented with Bicycle Friendly Community Bronze plaque by Share the Road Cycling Coalition. Dayle posted blog. Thanks to Wayne Noble from Caledon for taking photo of Brampton receiving award. Brampton Guardian published a story: "City of Brampton achieves bike friendly status" on Apr 17<sup>th</sup>, where David was quoted. City published a media release.
