Brampton City Update:

- 1. Kevin is developing a web app to track bicycle infrastructure projects and submitted a report on his progress. It will run in the Bicycle Infrastructure Projects tab on the BikeBrampton website. It pulls data from publicly accessible databases from both City and Region, further explained in his blog, Brampton GeoHub: Storytelling with data.
 - Discussion ensued about BFIP implementation and concerns about the safety of urban shoulders, how cycling infrastructure will be supported in the ATMP
- Report on Council Delegations Kevin delegated June is Bike Month/BCAC Workplan on May 15th.
 David delegated about Bike the Creek on May 31st. <u>Agenda</u> see pp. 11-31 of 260 (presentation slides 5.2-1 to 5.2-20). YouTube starts 27:00 and ends 39:17.
- Ontario Bike Summit (OBS), Polly Kevin and Polly attended on Apr 12-13th on behalf of BCAC. Polly submitted her <u>report</u>. Dayle was there for the awards supper, thanks to Region of Peel. Brampton was presented with Bicycle Friendly Community Bronze plaque by Share the Road Cycling Coalition, which is available for booth displays. Dayle posted <u>blog</u>. Brampton Guardian published a <u>story: "City of Brampton achieves bike friendly status"</u> on Apr 17th, where David was quoted. City published a <u>media release</u>.

- 4. **Community Rides** 1st ride May 28th Lisa reported 24 riders attended. Next ride, Tuesday June 6th. Members to register online, even if they are volunteer leaders.
- 5. <u>Main/Queen Streetscape Final Report</u> (presented to Council May 31st) –David reported a number of businesses in downtown Brampton are requesting their patrons sign a petition requesting that on-street parking be kept on Main and Queen. Kevin posted <u>Support Downtown Reimagined</u> blog.

Bike to School Week May 29 – Jun 2, 2017 - Erica reported 151 Peel schools signed up for BTSW 2017. A list of schools is posted on the Walk and Roll website. Some schools did not sign up because the principal was concerned about lack of adequate bike parking. Lisa reported 115 bikes in the R.J Lee racks this past Thursday.

4. Prioritized list of infrastructure projects

1. TRCA Trails Report: Vince D'Ellia

Discussion about trail surfacing, (gravel vs. asphalt). Lisa reported she recently rode the new trail in Heart Lake Conservation Area and found the gravel surface has degraded with large gravel rising to the surface. David indicated possible alternative in Mississauga Erindale Park where plastic honeycomb material was used to secure screenings. Mississauga is installing asphalt on their sections of ECT this summer, (behind HP building south of the 401). Vince indicated he would explore solutions and let us know. **Action** – David to follow up with Vince re trail surfacing

- a. Vince reported **Valleywood Southfields Phase 2**, (Pinewood Circle in Valleywood to trail behind new homes at Dougall in Southfields), to be completed this June.
- b. Vince reported construction on **Kennedy Valley** trail to start this summer from west of 410 to Mount Charles Park in Mississauga. Will include bridge crossing creek, E of 407 just before Tomken. In 2018 plan is to connect to Powerade Centre where a trailhead will be created. An additional bridge is needed here. Another mini-trail head planned for West Creek Blvd, with a parking lot. **Action: Dayle** to send Vince pictures from KVT with Dayle, David and Peter done
- c. Vince reported, **Sherway** trail construction, (connection under the QEW bridge at the West Mall) will go ahead this September.

BikeBrampton priorities:

- a. Heart Lake Road Mitigation strategy David reported that consultant retained and mitigation report work has begun. TRCA produced video. Nelson has received draft report.
