Well, the Brampton Bicycle Advisory Committee has certainly noticed this issue and is working with City of Brampton traffic engineering folks to remedy the situation!

Our BBAC member Polly was quoted in an article in The Brampton Guardian by Pam Douglas on July 5, 2014.

When one considers how much Brampton has grown and the number of bicycle commuters who choose to leave their car at home, it is easy to see why this is such an issue in Brampton. Commuter cyclists benefit their own health and fitness, and lessen traffic congestion for those who must drive.

Do you let your children bike to school?

BRAMPTON KIDS ON BIKES

Only a small percentage of children in Brampton's primary and secondary schools use active transportation (walking or cycling) alternatives to travel to and from school. That percentage has been dropping over the past number of years. Inactivity leads to significant health related issues for Brampton's youth. Current programs aimed at encouraging active transportation are piecemeal, aimed at a small percentage of the youth population and focused on a

school by school basis.

The **Heart and Stroke Foundation** has given BBAC
a SPARK advocacy grant to
research this issue, identify
the barriers and ultimately
develop a program to reverse
this trend.

FRANCESCHINI BRIDGE

We are so fortunate to have many interesting trails in Brampton, one of which is the Esker Lake Trail, just west of highway #410.

Pam Douglas in The Brampton Guardian on July 24, 2014 described the possibility of Brampton re-engineering the old Franceschini bridge to "give cyclists in the north and west ends of the city a safe way to get to several destinations including the Region of

Peel offices, the Bramalea bus terminal and Bramalea City Centre". "The 410 currently presents a significant barrier for the majority of cyclists in the city because existing crossings are busy arterial routes that require the cyclist to either share the lane in heavy traffic with buses and trucks, or dismount and walk long distances across bridges that are often not designed for either cyclists or pedestrians"
