#### **Brampton City Update:**

- **1.** David updated on Brampton Grow Green Network meeting #3 of Feb 20<sup>th</sup>. <u>Dayle's report</u> Grow Green Eco Pledge 2018 is being held Apr 22<sup>nd</sup> at Eldorado Park. BikeBrampton/BCAC is being asked to host a booth again.
- 2. Riverstone Lisa reported on her questions answered at the open house, following our discussion at the last meeting <u>Lisa's report</u> She concluded that the purchase was likely good value for the city despite negative comments on social media.
- 3. Toronto International Bike Show <u>Dayle's report</u>

#### **Regional Update:**

1. **Sustainable Transportation Strategy and Five-Year Implementation Plan** Erica reported on this plan that was presented to regional council on Feb 22<sup>nd</sup> by Janette Smith, Commissioner of Public Works; Nancy Polsinelli, Commissioner of Health; and Jessica Hopkins, Medical Officer of Health. See pages 115-149, item 10.2.1 of the <u>agenda</u>. Report highlights:

The Sustainable Transportation Strategy (the Strategy) is an action plan that outlines the Region of Peel's roles and responsibilities to significantly increase the proportion of trips made by sustainable transportation modes: walking, cycling, transit, carpooling and trips avoided through teleworking.

The strategy includes a target of 50 per cent of peak period trips made by sustainable transportation modes in the Region by 2041 (referred to as "mode share target"). This represents an approximate 13 per cent increase from current conditions, and is aligned with the upcoming Long Range Transportation Plan update.

More than 50 actions are recommended in the Strategy. These actions are operationalized in the Active Transportation Five-Year Implementation Plan and Transportation Demand Management Five-Year Implementation Plan. These actions will improve mobility, community health, the natural environment, and transportation system performance.

The Region will seek to increase its funding for Smart Commute Transportation Management Associations in conjunction with local municipalities and Metrolinx, as well as through the annual budgeting process.

The investment to implement the programs and projects recommended in the Strategy to 2041 is estimated to be \$207 million for active transportation infrastructure, plus \$1.8 million annually for non-infrastructure related active transportation and demand management programs.

The appropriate allocation of funding sources to implement the Sustainable Transportation Strategy will be presented through the 2018 Development Charges Background Study and the annual budgeting process.

- 2. <u>Bike to School Week</u> (B2SW) last week of May. Out of 58 GTHA schools registered so far, 15 are from Brampton: St. Edmund Campion SS, Brampton Centennial SS, St. Augustine SS, Rowntree PS, Central Peel SS, St Martin Catholic SS, St Marguerite d'Youville, St Augustine SS, Edenbrook Hill PS, Cardinal Leger, St Jean Brebeuf, St Thomas Aquinas, Louise Arbour SS, William Parkway Sr PS, Georges Vanier. Erica presented the historical context of 25 schools the 1<sup>st</sup> year, 52 the 2<sup>nd</sup> year and 152 schools last year. Peel surpassed Toronto despite smaller size, fewer kids, poorer infrastructure. Lisa reminded us of her positive experience at RJ Lee PS. The librarian stated her kiss and ride management had gone from being the most difficult task to being the easiest with no traffic jams following B2SW. Schools, parents, children need to be reminded each year to reinforce the message. Erica's experience has been the success of making the event into a challenge with prizes. The 1<sup>st</sup> 25 secondary schools have been offered a bike rack. Many schools have racks and need more. Action: Erica to send Dayle B2SW bulletin of prizes and details for updating webpage
- 3. <u>Bike Month</u> Book Ride, Bramalea CycleFest, Bike to Work Day, CeleBrampton BikeFest, Bike the Creek see events for details
- 4. **PSARTS** (Peel Safe and Active Routes to School) 17 stakeholders on this committee. David reported that PSARTS has been asked to provide input into school transportation vision for the

province (Metrolinx). There was discussion about the \$1.4 million extra that was spent on bussing in Peel with lowered distances.

#### **Community Engagement**

<u>Brampton Bike Hub</u> (Canadabikes.org EcoAction Grant, partnering with PCHS) – David reported that there will be an <u>Eco Action National Webinar</u> at City Hall WT-2C on March 28<sup>th</sup> 7-8:30pm.

We are continuing to have new participants sign up for Pedalwise, and have 12 protégés matched with 10 mentors. One protégé moved to Saskatchewan and was quite disappointed having only had one very encouraging meeting with Barry before he was transferred. Lisa and Maryna reported they had their 1<sup>st</sup> mentor-protégé cycle to the meeting tonight!

2. Prioritized list of infrastructure projects

#### TRCA Trails:

- a. **Etobicoke Creek Trail** surfacing being re-evaluated north of Mayfield. Brampton owns 600m north of Mayfield. Needs to be coordinated between Brampton & Caledon with TRCA. Councillor Whillans cycled September Community Ride and saw first-hand how rough the gravel path is, especially for road bikes. **Action:** encouragement for political support for paving ECT, especially in light of provincial OMCIP funding of \$1.7 million
- b. Valleywood to Southfields trail & bridge: Official Opening, Bike the Creek, Town Ride 11:00, Jun 23<sup>rd</sup>
- c. Kennedy Valley Trail extension- Kennedy Road to Westcreek Blvd in time for Bike the Creek's City

Loop Ride.

- d. **Sherway Trail** construction spring 2018 construction. Bridge under QEW will be proceeding. **BikeBrampton priorities:**
- a. Heart Lake Road Mitigation strategy David and Dayle sitting on TAC (Technical Advisory Committee) Awaiting 2<sup>nd</sup> TAC. Heart Lake Wetland Complex is 7<sup>th</sup> out of 2260 most important provincially significant wetland on MNR's Ontario Wetland Evaluation System. Heart Lake Road AT blog as result of 1<sup>st</sup> PIC held Nov 2<sup>nd</sup>. Heart Lake is part of Brampton city loop, connecting Esker Lake Trail, up Heart Lake Road, through Heart Lake Conservation Area to Mayfield Rd.
- b. Worn pavement lines on existing infrastructure (eg. Bonny Braes Road, Rutherford, Bleasdale) Members' responses to 311 calls have occasionally been prompt and have occasionally required follow up calls. Discussion about benefit and positive visibility for city to acknowledge the 311 caller again, once issue has been fixed.
- c. Clairville & Queen St E intersection Steve reported this intersection requires a "no u turn" sign. Ebenezer is a safer route. follow up required
- d. Finch & Steeles intersection Lisa reported this intersection should have a "beg" button to allow crossing from north to south follow up required
