Brampton City Update:	1. Cross-Ride signals at Scott/James & Queen Street – Definition requested: Similar to crosswalks, they allow cyclists to remain on their bikes and safely cross through intersections. They are generally connected to dedicated cycling facilities such as segregated bike lanes, cycle tracks and other cycling infrastructure. The cross-ride may be identified with thick painted blocks on either side, sometimes enhanced with arrowed bicycle stencils and/or green paint. At signalized intersections, the cyclist may remain on their bike and cross the road when the signal display (usually a small lit bicycle) indicates that the cyclist has the right-of-way. At intersections, proceed cautiously along the marked cross-ride and watch for left- and right-turning vehicles (both ahead, behind, and to the right of you) to be sure that they are yielding. Always travel at a reasonable cross that allows for you to stop if needed. Do not need that allows for you to stop if needed. Do not need that allows for you to stop if needed.

Action: members to request traffic engineering to activate the signals at the Queen St. cross-ride. Discussion about the issue with cross-rides in Mississauga at Burnhamthorpe and Ponytrail.



The cross-ride signals have been bagged due to light pole and bollard obstruction on the bike lane. Proper coordination amongst city departments responsible for installation and proper education of drivers is required. Cars turning right on red need adequate sightlines before proceeding. One option is to prohibit right turns on red if the location warrants this. Region of Peel is looking at shutting down all their regional road cross-rides. This would be most unfortunate, as these are valuable pieces of infrastructure for safe convenient cycling. Important to support our engineering experts who know the standards for proper design. **Action:** members to email their Regional Councillors for cross-ride support.

Peel Community Cycling
Program TenderDavid reported that the partnership of PCHS, BikeBrampton, Town of Caledon and Caledon Community
Services was successful at winning the CCP tender by Region of Peel. The program will run from Jan
2019 to Jun 2020, with expansions to at least one more site in Brampton and 2 in Caledon (Bolton and
Southfields). Discussion about potential for expansion in Brampton at The Journey (Ardglen) and City

		 Hall. More mentors are needed and those who feel they have graduated from Pedalwise and would like to become mentors are invited to the mentor training, slated for April. Alina will be putting on our Winter cycling seminar on Wed Mar 6th. Jason will be conducting a Nutrition seminar on Wed May 1st. The EcoAction winter/spring incentive has been announced. We were up 700% more in kilometres logged in Dec/18 vs. Dec/17. Results will be published on the Brampton EcoAction Group in Strava. The new contest is based on group accomplishment and runs until the end of June. Remember to log your active transportation cycling trips as "commute" to count, so you can participate in the prizes.
