Brampton City Update:

- 1. Big Ask \$1,875M approved by Council to be spent on cycling infrastructure project. Dayle, David and Kevin have generated a proposal at the request of Councillor Santos with the purpose to identify priority projects from the cycling community both for this budget year but also to have "shovel ready" projects and seek funding from other government levels. Ottawa has 25 rolling shovel ready projects. The proposal will be presented by Dayle to Committee of Council on April 03rd.
- 2. Brampton ATMP Dayle indicated the City has posted an ATMP update from the presentation made to BCAC in November, 2018 <u>ATMP (Active Transportation Master Plan) update</u>
- 3. Eco-Action David provided an update on the Winter/Spring Carbon Reduction Challenge. February results show more than 1,500km ridden, a 290% increase over February results from 2018.
- 4. OBS19 David indicated he will be presenting at the Ontario Bike Summit this year on the Bike Hub success.
- 5. ISB David provided an update on his delegation to City Council on February 3rd. The subject was referred to staff with a request to have it brought back to Council before the summer
- 6. Heart Lake Road Dayle provided an update on the study and noted the report was well researched and recommends Heart Lake Road be designated as a cultural heritage landscape
- 7. Bike Show- the group discussed booth support at the upcoming show.
- 8. CCP update –

- 9. Discussion about snow clearing on pathways and bike parking being inadequate with too much salt and not enough snow clearing and removal

Regional Update:

- 1. **Biking Beyond Downtown** Lisa, David and Dayle attended the panel discussion. Lisa reported the highlights from the following workshop that she attended with Kevin and Amanjit:
 - a. Scarborough Cycles uses the Transportation Tomorrow survey to decide where to set up Hub programming,
 - b. They partnered with existing community organizations to tap into their clientele, reach is 2,000 potential clients
 - c. Many of those clients are coming in for reasons other than cycling but it still provides exposure
 - d. They have 4 full-time paid staff
 - e. Ability to deliver bike rodeos at schools
 - f. Have bike fleet that they take to secondary schools helping to turn students into advocates
 - g. Need good working relationship with the school boards
 - h. In Oakville, kids signed up for Strava but it didn't work
 - i. Need to rely on individual teacher or principal
