#### **Brampton City Update:**

- Big Ask \$1,875M approved by Council to be spent on cycling infrastructure project. After consultation with BikeBrampton members, Dayle to delegate to Committee of Council on April 3<sup>rd</sup>. See <u>Agenda</u> pages 29-63 for presentation slides and pages 63-116 for supporting report.
- 2. ATMP expected to come to Council in May
- 3. OBS19 David indicated he will be presenting at the Ontario Bike Summit this year on the Bike Hub EcoAction success. Erica will be presenting on Building a Cycling Culture in Peel.

### **Regional Update:**

- 1. Erica reported Judy Yak is Acting AT Manager, ROP.
- 2. Bike to School Week is targeting 180 schools in Region. BikeBrampton event webpage
- 3. Crossrides on Mississauga Road are temporarily turned off due to discussions with MCAC. David reported he has made BikeBrampton's position known to Mississauga AT Manager and Region, as per our previous meeting discussion. There needs to be measurement of how crossrides are working, and then develop an educational program based on that research. Right now, they are a wasted asset, when turned off. Discussion about cyclists' duty to approach every intersection with defensive, techniques and not assume right of way means perfect safety. We need to look in every direction before proceeding, in the same manner as defensively driving a car or being a pedestrian. A crossride is designed for multiuse paths in the road allowance. It has a specific traffic light marked with bike symbols. It is illegal to ride on a crosswalk, which are the zebra-striped crossings designed

for pedestrians. If we use them, we must dismount and walk across the intersection. Without a crossride, we must ride on the road, at least adjacent to the crosswalk. Brampton will have to wait until ROP works this issue out with Mississauga, so that the policy is consistent across the Region. Members concluded that we want crossride signals turned to green 'on' position when the road traffic signal is green. We do not want to have to stop and push the 'beg' button to activate the crossride.

- 4. There is going to be a Bicycle Friendly Community seminar for Mississauga. They have Bronze status now and want the seminar to see about going for Silver.
- 5. Wayne reported that the Caledon AT Task Force had their first meeting the previous week, run by Eric Chan. The members were picked by January and budget has been assigned. Policy is that every rural road resurfacing will include a wide paved shoulder. They have found that it improves edge quality of road surface since the heavy vehicles damage the edge. Signed bike routes have a higher level of care swept twice/month, and are maintained 6 months/year. Policy is to have shovel-ready projects. Once approved, projects have a contractor on-site within 2 weeks. It is expected that 7 of the 9 Caledon Councillors (including Mayor) will show up to participate in Bike the Creek.
