Brampton City Update:	 Big Ask – Nelson Cadete submitted a report (Agenda item 9.2.1, p.436) back to <u>Committee of</u> <u>Council</u> (Minutes p.20, item 9.2.1) on May 29th. The report was received without presentation. Report Overview: \$1.875 Million from the 2018 Operating Budget surplus has been allocated to a Project Budget to implement active transportation infrastructure projects. Through consultations with the cycling community the following three priority projects were identified: o Enhance existing recreational trails with proper road crossings; o An east-west protected cycling route; and o A north-south protected cycling route. These priority projects are consistent with the intended recommendations of City's draft Active Transportation Master Plan (ATMP), which outlines a strategy for implementing a connected cycling and pedestrian network across Brampton, and facilitating and encouraging cycling both as a recreational activity and as a viable transportation mode choice for everyday purposes. A City staff project team is currently undertaking a feasibility review of the three proposed projects with a view to the following: o consistency with the proposed recommendations of the draft ATMP o traffic implications o planned construction conflicts/opportunities o public acceptance o costs (capital and operating/maintenance)

I Strategic Communications staff will assist with the development and execution of a communications strategy and educational outreach.

- \$1,875M approved by Council to be spent on cycling infrastructure project. After consultation with BikeBrampton members, Dayle delegated the <u>Report</u> to Committee of Council on April 3rd. See <u>Agenda</u> pages 29-63 for presentation slides and pages 63-116 for supporting report. <u>Youtube Video</u> of delegation and Council questions starts at 52-minute mark and ends at 1:38.45, totaling 42 minutes. Discussion about Vodden currently being resurfaced over #410 and importance of coordinating these opportunities.
- 2. **ATMP** expected to come to Planning Committee September 23rd. Staff will be adding the information gathered in the AT workshop at the 2040 Vision day event.
- 3. Community Rides Lisa reported there have been 4 rides with 10 to go. Contact her for volunteer opportunities. We are offering 5 km routes on all rides, if there is any demand, and with sufficient volunteers, we can offer a 'slow roller' option with chance to turn back early depending on needs of the group. Importance of making sure new riders are assessed for tires pumped, seat heights. Radios would be VERY helpful to make volunteer contact safer and better.

Regional Update:

- Bike to School Week Erica reported that Peel has moved from 25 schools participating in 2015, to 52, to 152, to 165, to finally 189 in 2019! Peel accounts for 32% of all the schools participating in Ontario! We have more active schools than Toronto, which scored 125 this year <u>BikeBrampton</u> <u>event webpage</u> The breakdown was 161 elementary, 9 middle, 19 secondary. 70% filled out postevent surveys, due to staff persistence. Walkober is taking place in October.
- 2. CCP our newest Brampton Bike Hub, located at The Journey, 9 Ardglen, will be having a focus group, facilitated by Angela Bennett, on Jun 27th. Purpose is to gather initial data on residents and program participants, which will be followed up with a post survey this fall. Joe will have the tools and be open every Thursday 6:30-8:30pm.
