




- 29.3km of 2021 infrastructure is all about Connecting the Network
- 'Build it, educate them, they will come...'

- Reduces traffic congestion, slows speed, lowers carbon emissions

- Mother towing child in trailer on sidewalk






Central Park Drive (Clark to Torbram)

- Bramalea Torbram, 2021






- Consider safety (Vision Zero), best practices, our user experience
- 4 Options:
 - ▶ 1. Do nothing (ends before intersection)
 - ▶ 2. Sharrows (merge vehicles & cars)
 - ▶ 3. Dashed lines
 - 4. Solid lines



Glenvale Blvd. - bike lane to be installed, no intersection treatment yet


