### **Brampton City Update:**

- 1. ATMP Annual Report Mar 9<sup>th</sup> Council meeting update —Staff Report, Committee of Council Slides, Livestream Video 2:26. Committee of Council passed unanimously after debate. Staff handled questions well. Budget of \$8 million includes pandemic 'catch up' from last year, as well as implementation as part of regular road resurfacing schedule, and Claireville Conservation Area multi-use trail. David's Delegation, Cindy's delegation letter was read out loud. These encouraged Council to continue to support the ATMP and the 2040 Vision as per the Climate Emergency. Tyron's Bike Lanes in Brampton Video was not played at Council, but we reviewed it during the meeting. Tyron was praised and the use of this video for subsequent delegation opportunity will be very positive. Yvon suggested that members advocate to incumbent and candidates during the next election.
- 2. Different Spokes Downtown Brampton Bike Hub Sonia reported that proposed downtown location at 8 Nelson was approved at Council on Mar 9<sup>th</sup>. She is awaiting the City to sign the lease, which will be for 2 years with an option for a third year. City will need to make construction repairs to the space first before Sonia can outfit it for a bike hub. The space will be shared with PCHS for use in their one-on-one counselling. Yvon commented that 8 Nelson is the perfect downtown location. The schedule for the BikeWrx pop-ups is being prepared. Returning to in-person is being assessed as per COVID restrictions. The schedule there could potentially be bi-weekly. Action: contact <a href="sonia@bikebrampton.ca">sonia@bikebrampton.ca</a> if you can volunteer to construct work benches. - 3. Brampton Community Ride Program Update Registration for Cycling Advisory Committee's (BCAC) 14 rides for 2022. Both 5 and 15km options, from May to October, on Tuesday evenings and Sunday afternoons. Link to descriptions. Each start location has a hyperlink to the google map exact starting point. Where possible, routes will link to Brampton Bike Hub BikeWrx pop-ups. Refreshments, complements of City of Brampton. We need leaders, marshalls and sweeps a minimum of 6 volunteers for each event. The City will be providing walkie-talkies and T-shirts for communication and visibility of volunteers. Extra volunteers are needed for riders who might need to be escorted on a shortcut, although riders are encouraged to select their route according to their ability. Action: Check out Lisa's spreadsheet of rides & positions needed filling, especially needed are 5km leaders. Be in touch with Lisa to volunteer. Select sweep, then marshall and finally lead positions as you gain experience.
- 4. Williams Pkwy noise wall Brampton Guardian, Mar 13<sup>th</sup> by Graeme Frisque. No decision yet.
- **5. Canada National Pedal Poll** David gave overview on this national data collection program. Brampton has been selected as one of the communities this year. **Action:** Details on Pedal Poll at next meeting.

#### **Regional Update:**

- <u>Bike the Creek</u> David MOU (Memorandum of Understanding) commitment for event partner BikeBrampton. David and Dayle have been asked to delegate to Council in April. – **Actions:** Need volunteers:
  - a. Group assistance to touch up route stencils, install signage in April, May
  - b. Lead dignitary rides (shorter & longer one) Lisa, Steve
  - c. Day of Event volunteers BikeBrampton/BCAC display booth at Jim Archdekin
  - d. Bike Rodeo volunteers (9:00am 12:00pm)
  - e. Identify sponsors sponsorship package
  - f. Social media postings early and often, as soon as registration opens!
- 2. CCP (Community Cycling Program) Year 3 Final Report
- **3. Sustainable Caledon Taskforce** David reported he has been invited to sit on new taskforce. Meeting 4x / year, this is part of Caledon's Climate Change adaptation implementation. Wayne volunteered to sit on taskforce when David is unavailable.

### **BikeBrampton Projects:**

- 1. **NE Sunday morning rides**, leaving from McDonald's (Bramalea and Sandalwood Pkwy) at 9:30am. Lisa will send out notices to those interested. It's a pleasant ride and opportunity to learn more about the area and enjoy outdoor visits. Pedalwise protégés and mentors are welcome!
- 2. **Earth Day Environmental Festival Bike Tour** Apr 23<sup>rd</sup> David reported that Brampton Environmental Alliance (BEA) is working with the City on this event. <u>Guardian article</u>. Meet at 9-9:30 (depending on location distance) to ride to Norton Place Park. BikeBrampton will have a booth tent from 10:00-2:00. There is a planned short ride in the neighbourhood area returning to the park. TRCA is planning tree planting, chalk painting and other kids' activities. They are expecting 100-150 people. **Action:** David is looking for 3 bike tour leaders, and volunteers to work 1hr shifts at the booth. Let him know your availability. More details on <u>BEA website</u>. Register on Eventbrite for event to guarantee free lunch.
- 3. **Nomination for Share the Road Wheels of Change award** Dayle reported our submission was deemed very impressive. They will create a category for politician next year, however, Professional category was intended to be a municipal staff person.
- 4. **Bike Parking** Steve is targeting Lakeridge Mall. He contacted Foodland, owned by Sobey's. The store manager has yet to respond. Bruce suggested that Steve encourage Sobey's to make bike parking a corporate policy and then roll out Foodland as a pilot. Issue may have more to do with landlord than tenant cooperation. However, there is cart storage in the parking lot, so this is a precedent. Encouragement of cargo bike grocery pick up is a possibility! Brampton has a bike friendly business program that potentially has bike racks. Decathlon offers customized bike racks. **Action:** Steve to continue to update us. Please send Steve an email if you want better bike parking at a retail location.
- 5. **May & June BikeBrampton meetings** Sonia has offered to chair these meetings in the absence of David and Dayle.

### **Caledon Update**

- 1. Wayne reported that Caledon is reprinting their bike route maps, which will be available at the Bike the Creek Caledon booth and at Jim Archdekin pavilion.
- 2. Velocity will be held on July 1st, run by Caledon Community Services. It will start at Town Hall and feature a family ride on Caledon Trailway, and 50 & 100km loops.
