Shift in Transportation Patterns 2016-2021

- Sustainable mode share increased by 8%
- Cycling mode share increased by 70%
- 113% of Peel' Sustainable Transportation Strategy Target

¹Collected samples of the Region of Peel were pooled and weight-adjusted to represent the regional population distribution. The 2021 COVHITS is a relatively small sample survey (compared to the traditional TTS) and is prone to be skewed towards specific population segments (e.g., smaller household size and younger people). Any conclusions drawn from the COVHITS data may not be representative of actual trends.


Mississauga 'School Streets' Pilot, 2022

- 31% increase in rates of walking, cycling and other AT modes (Hillside PS)
- Air pollution reduced 65% (Hillside PS)
- 38% AM and 42% PM decreases in average daily number of vehicles
- From pilot to mainstream need for more funding





Success we can build on!



CCP Key Outcomes: 2018-2021

- Increased bicycle accessibility
 - 288 borrowed bikes, 2,723 bikes repaired, 349 bikes donated into the community
- Cycling education
 - 6,611 people trained on bike repair
 - Increased knowledge, skill and confidence
- Create a cycling culture
 - 274 cycling outreach events, 11,303 residents served
 - 160,000 social media impressions
- 28% average increase in cycling behaviour
- 10% average decrease in driving behaviour

2023 Transportation Budget Concerns


- Loss of dedicated AT staff FTE funding
- Reduced commitment to AT education & encouragement funding
- Unclear prioritization of AT infrastructure projects or completions
- Unclear prioritization of AT in general
- Sustainable transportation focus exclusively on transit
- Lack of targets and metrics for success outcomes




- Yet cyclist collisions increased 48% during the same period!


Vulnerable road users should matter for VisionZero!

Recommendations - Reports

- Council should request Regional reports on AT projects and programs to ensure complete understanding of gaps and successes to-date:
 - Community Cycling Program Retrospective Analysis
 - Community Cycling Program projects final reports:
 - Mississauga Cycles
 - Sheridan Bike Hub
 - Brampton/Caledon Bike Hub
 - Current Sustainable Transportation Strategy

Recommendations –Budgets/Targets

- Higher priority and funding in 2023 budget to AT projects and programs from proposed \$2.85 million to \$10 million (the 2018-2022 STS recommended annual funding from \$13.7-\$15.6 million)
- Renewed commitment to STS with annual measured AT build KM targets, completions and funding
- Renewed commitment to Resolution 2021-402
- Consultation with Peel active transportation community groups and projects on next 5-year STS, by June 2023
