	March minutes (April was our 10 th anniversary celebration at Different Spokes.) Steve moved, approved.
Brampton City Update	1. Bike lanes –
	 a. Cindy reported sharrows on Jayfield. They are nicely out from curb, which is safer than inviting vehicles to pass bikes too closely. Sharrows are used when the road is too narrow for bike lanes. b. Cindy reported still experiencing right hooks on Centre St. bike lanes. (Streets for People education insert will be coming with our property tax bills.) Lisa presented last August BCAC meeting, that we need physical separation at intersections. The City has reported 90-98% non-compliance of drivers at intersections. City is re-studying. Lisa suggests knock-down sticks to separate. Howden & Dixie is another major intersection where most of us experience drivers crossing the solid line to enter the bike lane for right turns. Some do so out of ignorance. Others do it even after it is explained to them. Education is important and the best solution will be physical separation. c. Celebrations for new bike lanes: Nelson reported at a previous meeting that there are different contractors for different painted lines, etc, so they would need to be coordinated, so that the bike lanes are mostly completed, all at once. He will investigate, and inform the ATAC, to arrange opening ceremonies. Action: follow up 2. Community Rides – Lisa –see the City website for themed rides. (BikeBrampton website) Sign up for one or several rides with one registration. Riders can get automatic reminders before each ride. 5 and 15 km routes. Let Lisa know if you can volunteer. Action: Dayle to add QR Code, update the

rider briefing and laminate. Done. Lisa to borrow radios – done.

- 3. **Bike Month Proclamation at Council** May 31st. David will be delegating at request of Staff, in support of Bike Month being proclaimed at City Hall. Dayle and Steve will be present. All are welcome to attend. Wednesday morning.
- 4. Pedal Poll Peter Maloney from COB AT, presented this year's Velo Canada Bikes' national Pedal Poll. Data is gathered to promote safe cycling/AT across Canada. This can influence policy, make Canada greener and more equitable for all road users. The Executive Director said: "Brampton's participation is an example for other communities across Canada". June 13th & 17th, 50 x 2-hour time slots. Brampton volunteer sign-up registration. High, medium and low volume areas selected from different equity areas. This year-over-year data collection supports our local AT projects. 59.6% of Brampton's greenhouse gas emissions come from the transportation sector. 80% of those are from single occupancy vehicles.
