Review & approve minutes from last meeting

May Meeting Minutes - Steve moved to approve with adjustments. Passed

Brampton City ATAC Update

- 1. ATAC Update See ATAC meeting minutes from the City
 - a. Pedestrian Intervals "head start" program Steve spoke about advantages for safety
 - b. OBS 2024 update Cindy/Lisa
 - **c. Royal West Drive resident meeting** discussion about a methodical approach for introducing AT infrastructure.
 - **d. eScooter project update** scooter trips add to AT heat map, especially around transit hubs.
 - e. **BikeFest in** Chinguacousy Park. Heavy rain limited attendance. Booths from City AT, e-scooter companies, Region of Peel. Sonia's team provided bike parking. Replaces CeleBrampton BikeFest and B2WD. Next Bikefest -last Saturday in May 2025.
 - f. Bike to Work Day for Brampton City staff only
 - g. Vodden AT Lanes update barriers have been installed except at the 410 bridge where special permission is required from MTO before installation approved.
- 2. Shah raised the issue that AT lanes on Central Park south of Queen create conflict zones with buses on one side and fast-moving traffic on the other. Shah sent a letter to his Councillor with no response. David suggested Shah send another letter as follow up. Shah is suggesting the sidewalk be turned into a MUP to mitigate this conflict zone with the buses.

- **3. Bike Basics Courses** Dayle reported adequate attendance despite problems with registration information on the City's website. Recreation has committed to running the courses again in 2025.
- 4. Delegation to Planning Committee, (see link)
 - a. <u>Lisa, David, Dayle</u> and Barry all presented to Planning Committee, positioning City plans, aspects of governance and how Council and staff can deal with resident objections to bike infrastructure installation. Moaz Ahmad, from Scooty also delegated in support of AT infrastructure. The 3 delegation links are part of Lisa's initiative to clearly explain city's plans, governance and how to deal with objections. The focus is on equity, since many people do not have access to cars.
- 5. AT Lane issues BikeBrampton members to meet with AT Planning and Traffic Ops staff
 - a. Purpose of the meeting to raise the issue that infrastructure planned for in the ATMP is being removed by individual Councillors without proper process. Examples include: Conestoga, Inspire. Bike lanes on Royal West and Remembrance Drive are threatened due to resident complaints.
 - b. Staff indicated significant objections raised by businesses and residents on Inspire causing disruptions to traffic and emergency response vehicles. Police had to be called on one occasion. Decision was to remove the bike lanes on Inspire and replace with angle parking.
 - **c.** It is evident that a process is needed to address complaints without sacrificing the integrity of the AT network. David to arrange a meeting with AT and Traffic Ops staff for June 28th. If necessary a follow-up meeting to be arranged with Commissioner Ganesh.
- 6. Community Rides update Lisa
 - a. Slow roll 15km ride added this year to reduce frustration of the faster group, make it easier to get through intersections and provide an opportunity for inexperienced riders to try riding longer distances.
 - **b.** Additional 3 volunteers required to staff this extra group.

7. Bill 40 - Alina

- **a.** TCAT and The Biking Lawyer are advocating for this bill which includes stringent penalties for motorists involved in collisions with vulnerable road users, particularly hit & run collisions.
 - i. Asking for 12-month licence suspension in the case of a motorist causing serious injury or death,
 - ii. Plus remedial training and community service,
 - iii. Plus mandatory appearance in traffic court to acknowledge seriousness of their actions
- **b.** A group of 8 people, (including Alina), and "Friends and Families for Safe Streets", met with MPP Rick Brease, Parliamentary Assistant to the Minister of Transportation. Mr. Brease appeared to miss the point, stating that the injured party could always sue in civil court. Our contention is that Driving Under Influence penalties are more severe than Failing to Remain (hit and run).
- **c.** Next step is to meet with Minister Sakaria. Not likely to happen until the government returns in mid October.
